CHANGES TO THE 2007 ONTARIO FIRE CODE Thursday, April 23rd, 2009

with emphasis on High Hazard Industrial Occupancies***

The 2007 Ontario Fire Code became law in Ontario on November 21st 2007. This workshop is especially designed for OIFPA members responsible for fire code compliance, fire safety and emergency preparedness at industrial sites. The program emphasizes changes to the code especially Part 4 – and sections impacting on high hazard occupancies and includes some practical coping strategies for maintaining compliance in an era of increasing zero tolerance enforcement.

The program examines the following topics:

- Overview of the 2007 OFC format, concepts, definitions
- Division A – performance based code solutions as a concept

 3. Part 4 – spill planning requirements for Flammable liquids
 4. Part 5 – Hazardous processes & materials – what's new
 5. Part 6 – tests checks & inspections revisited
- Coping strategies to get or maintain compliance
- ***Working with fire officials***

All information is presented in both “code-speak” and plain language with strategies to help you solve problems and educate others. Content is flexible based on the needs and interests of the participants. To accommodate the needs of high hazard industries this program will devote more time to OFC Part 4 – but all the training materials for the other fire code programs in this series will be available.
